5. Indicate Status: **Amateur, Junior, Open, Western or Eventer** and include **SIGNATURE. ONE** horse/rider combination per entry.
6. Non-Compete horses, \$50 inc. office fee & bridle #.
7. Classes may not be run in numerical order.
8. Rules in accordance with USEF and CAWDA except Training Equipment classes.
9. Helmet and Boots required, show coat, stock tie and braiding optional. (No sleeveless shirts)
10. Entries received after closing date and changed entries are subject to a \$15 per class fee.
11. **Entries received without payment will be charged a \$15 incomplete entry fee. No Fax, email, or text entries. Accepting a late entry, the responsible party will be liable to pay all class, office, stable and other fees. Withdrawing will not excuse payment of fees.**
12. **No Refunds after closing date.**
13. If show moves to rain date, there will be no refunds, unless rain date is rained out (less office fee.)

15. **All horses must provide current vaccine record with entry (Flu/Rhino less than 6 months old, Coggins only if out of state)**

**Opportunity Training Equipment Test:** equipment such as martingales, training bits, bucking straps and leg protection may be used. All equipment must be humane and used at the discretion of the show manager. Instructor/ trainers may coach during the test with a headset or calling. Training equipment classes do not receive ribbons only schooling.

### **Prix Caprilli**

PEC has decided to add Prix Caprilli to our Dressage Schooling Shows. It's something different to the normal dressage test and a bit of fun.

So what is a Prix Caprilli test you may ask?? A Prix Caprilli is a dressage test with jumps included. The tests have the same movements as our dressage tests and include the requirement for horse and rider to trot and/or canter over single jumps.

The judges will judge this test the same as a normal dressage test that includes technical marks for the movement, impulsion, submission and riding. The emphasis is not the jumping style of the horse, it is on the horse's relaxation, obedience and evenness of pace. It is a dressage test that happens to have jumps in the way and the jumps should not disrupt the standard performance expected in a dressage test.

# California Dressage Society Dressage Accomplishment Club

## Who is Eligible:

Anyone showing "dressage" tests outside of USEF/USDF. CDS only shows, WDAA, Pony Club, IEA, IHSA, Working Equitation, Schooling Shows, Online Shows, CDW, USEA are all eligible

## Award Structure:

Tiered recognition based on total percentage scores from all tests submitted:

200 Percent Club    300 Percent Club    500 Percent Club  
(sample 65% + 62% + 68% + 61% + 63% = 319% Percent Club)

## How it Works:

Score Reporting Form will be sent to all nominated riders October 31.

Participants self-nominate at any time during the program year (Nov. 1 to Oct. 31) with payment of a nomination fee (\$35 per horse).

Riders may win the same award multiple years in a row and riders may win multiple awards with different horses (horse/rider combo wins the award).

Participants notify CDS October 31 with their scores when they have qualified for a specific tier (200, 300, 500 percent) with supporting test results

Nomination fee is for horse/rider team. A rider can qualify on multiple horses but needs to pay a nomination fee for each horse.

## Awards:

Awards sent after the end of the program year (Nov 1) for all tiered recognition levels (200, 300, 500 Club winners)
